### News from the Fillmore Lions, By Lion Hank Carrillo

The last six months of 2004 have been very rough for the Fillmore club. Within a period of two weeks we lost two of our fellow Lions, Lion Joe Galvan and Lion Jim Reves.

Then in December we lost another long time member, Lion Paul Morris. Lion Paul had been a member of Fillmore Lions and Lions International since June 1950. He had held every office in the club including President a number of times. Those Lions in the District who have visited the Fillmore Club know that they meet at what is called the Scout House. It is a log cabin looking building where a number of Boy Scout and Cub Scout Troops meet. Lion Paul was the only member of Fillmore Lions left who had helped build this structure.

Lion Joe had been a member of the Fillmore Lions and Lions International since November 1963. During that time he too had held every office in the Club, a number of them more then once. At the time of his death he was the Administrative Treasure of the club and had been for over ten years.

Lion Jim had been a member of the Fillmore Lions and Lions International since May 1984. He was without a doubt one of the hardest working members of the club, always volunteering for every fundraiser we have. He was always one of the first ones there and one of the last to leave. At the time of his death he was and had been a member of the cooking crew for over twelve years.

The death of these three fellow Lions has left a big void in the Fillmore Lions. Between the three of them they exemplified the Lions motto, "We Serve" and that is what they both did for over one hundred and five years.

On a happier note the Club its 56th Annual Enchilada Dinner on Saturday November 6th and it was a huge success. It was held at the Fillmore/Piru Veterans Memorial Building 511 2nd St. Fillmore. This is the same location where Fillmore will host District 4-A3 3rd Cabinet Meeting on February 18th & 19th 2005.

On Saturday August 28th 2004 the Club held its 2nd annual National Football League Punt, Pass & Kick program. This program creates a forum for boys and girls ages 8 to 15 to compete separately against their peers in punting, passing, and kicking skills. They compete against others their own age and gender. Accuracy is also part of the competition.

### **♦** LCIF Grant Application

More than 4.5 million people in the U.S. have Alzheimer's. That number will triple by 2050 (per the Alzheimer's Association). In addition, there are millions of other Children and adults afflicted with a variety of diseases that cause life changing brain impairments including, but not limited to, Dementia, Autism, Down's Syndrome and various forms of mental retardation and developmental Disabilities. Well over 50% of those suffering from brain impairments will wander and become lost at least once during their illness. They typically do not call out for help and do not respond to people calling out to them in search operations. As a result, a lost person with Alzheimer's or other forms of dementia represent a critical emergency. Nearly half of these people will die if not recovered within 24 hours.

The objective of this program is to provide the necessary equipment and training for care givers and local search & rescue personnel in order to assist in the recovery of lost, missing or wandering persons quickly. This program will facilitate rapid recovery of the afflicted person thus saving lives, many thousands of dollars in search related costs and untold grief for family members or care givers. Since this program was established in 1999 there have been over 1,054 rescues across the nation. The average recovery time was 22 minutes with a 100% success rate with no loss of life. Project Lifesaver International is endorsed by the National Sheriff's Association and the National Alzheimer's Foundation and the Lions Clubs of District 4-A3.

The transmitter testing equipment for each client is \$287.00 plus the monthly \$7.50 expense for the radio frequency (RF) broadcast band and battery. For both reliability and liability reasons the RF bands must be tested daily and batteries replaced monthly with detailed logs maintained. Lion Involvement The San Luis Obispo County (Region L) Lions Club's are adopting this project as a major, long term, commitment. The SLO Club encouraged and obtained the Sheriff's Department participation in this project. The SLO Lions Club has also agreed to coordinate the program and acquire the funds necessary to market and operate the program.

Amount requested: \$75,000.00 over a two year period.






