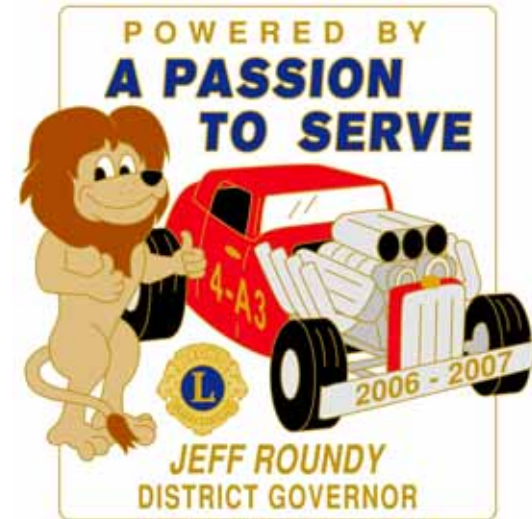

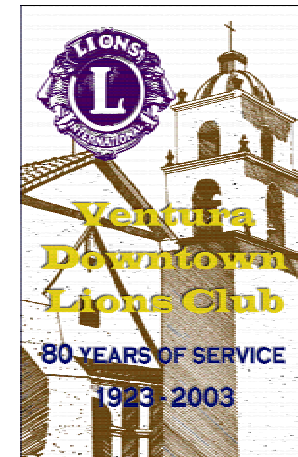

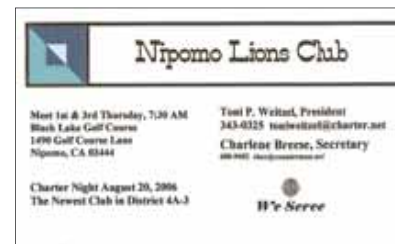

The District Governor **IS** the Program for the Meeting. Inform your Zone Chair who on the visitation team is provided with a comp meal. Courtesy says the DG and the VDG should be comped, but who else? Your Region and/or Zone Chairs? Other Cabinet Officers?

The DG always sits at the head of the table next to the President. If present, the VDG should sit next to the DG.

The Club President introduces the Zone Chair when appropriate to start the DG's program, not at the beginning of the meeting.

Check the DG's visitation schedule. Clear your calendar for the DG visit. If the date is not feasible, contact your Zone Chair or the District Admin Assistant right away.

District Meetings

Friday Nights will be BRAG NIGHTS, except for the August Meeting. Send the items you want to brag about at least two

weeks in advance to the District Admin. Assistant. Include a brief description with the 4-6 photos of your event. Items can be service projects, socials, fund raisers, etc.

Training sessions are designed to help you and your club. Encourage the club officers to attend, especially the club 1st V.P.

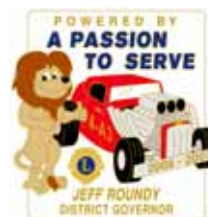

I've included some of President Ross' thoughts.

Create "newsworthy" events. Concentrate on local service activities and alert the media prior to the event. Invite them to participate and have a prepared statement ready. If your local media is PR friendly, invite them to the DG visitation and I'll do my best to "WOW" them appropriately. We must develop a personal relationship with the media. Focus on eyeglasses/exams for the needy and emergency response activities. The power of giving is our greatest asset, and we should be the "go-to" group when communities need help or want to contribute funds.

If you've never been to Boston, please do yourself a favor and go! It's a fascinating town that's just oozing with history, and amazing restaurants and shopping opportunities.
