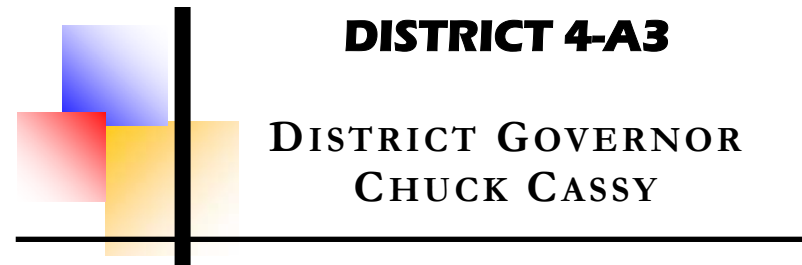

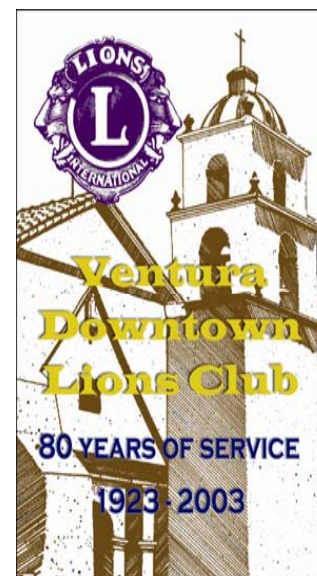
KATRINA AND LCIF

"LCIF has set up a designated fund for Lions and others who wish to help the hurricane victims. LCIF's normal policy is that Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) recognition is not allowed for designated donations. To encourage donations the Board of Trustees has amended the policy. Donations sent to LCIF for Hurricane Katrina relief from August 29 to November 30, 2005 (postmarked by November 30) are eligible for MJF recognition. To count, it must be a single US\$1000 payment from a donor. The Melvin Jones Fellow does not have to be named when the donation is made."

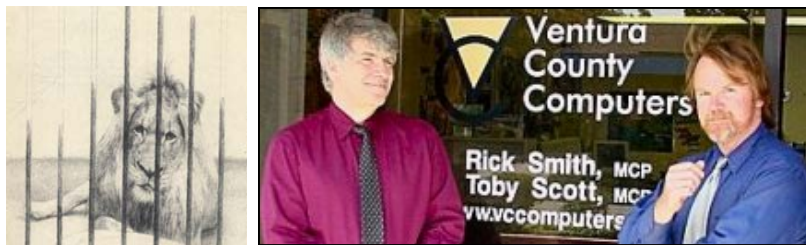

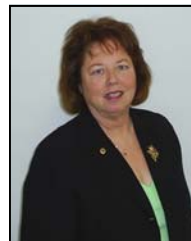
Youth Exchange

This year the Ventura Downtown Lions Club sponsored one student to go to Japan and hosted three students, Monica Dallari from Italy, Isabella Alf from Austria and Yohei Miyajima from Japan. It seems like we just finished this year's exchange and it is time to start next year's program. Contact local schools earlier and get the word out to our youth. Thousands of Youth have traveled a 5 week in-home stay, giving them the opportunity to study and understand other cultures and family living. Students are also sponsored from our area each year by the Exchange Foundation, which provides scholarships to students needing financial assistance to participate in the Youth Exchange program. Last year approximately \$10,000 in scholarships were provided. Fifty-six students participated in our visiting program, thirty-five went to Japan and twenty-one to Australia and Europe. Sixty participated in our hosting program, thirty-seven from Europe and twenty-two from Japan. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Carpinteria Lions Club for donating \$250.00, Lion Charles Hamilton and his son Erin of Carpinteria for hosting the Japanese student Lion Mark Laufbaum of the Pleasant Valley Lions Club for hosting a BBQ Party for the students. I am accepting donations and collecting contributions from clubs that pledged their help towards the Youth Exchange Program expenses.

PEACE POSTER CONTEST

The 2005-06 International Peace Poster Contest theme is "Peace Without Borders." Make sure you send your contest postcard (found in the kit) to the District Governor informing him of your club's participation. Reminder - **DO NOT** give the "Contest Label" to your schools. You will need to place it on the back of the winning poster you submit to the District Governor.

All club entries must be postmarked to the District Governor on or before November 15th, 2005. If you bring your winning posters to the November District meeting in San Luis Obispo, you will have met the deadline. Perhaps the Zone and Region Chairs can assist clubs in delivering posters to the District meeting.

The question has come up about multiple entries from one Lion's Club. The rules state that there is one winner per contest, so if a Lion's club sponsors several contests, it would seem that you could have multiple entries to the District Governor.

There are 2 major reason that entries are disqualified: 1) poster does not adhere to size requirements and 2) no lettering or signature is allowed on the face of the poster. I know all your entries are fantastic. Too bad we can only have one District winner.
